Pathways

At Strood Academy we pride ourselves on giving the students the opportunity to study a range of subjects in order to fulfil their potential and to leave our sixth form with the ability to choose their next steps.

We offer five pathways at Strood Academy:

- International Baccalaureate Careers Programme (IBCP)
- A Levels
- Vocational courses (e.g. BTECs)
- T Levels
- Strood Football Academy

The CP Curriculum

CP students undertake a minimum of two IB Diploma Programme (DP) courses and one vocational/applied course.Pupils will also take part in the core which consists of four components that includes approaches to learning, community and service, language development and a reflective project as well as an approved career-related course.

For CP students, DP courses provide the theoretical underpinning and academic rigour of the programme; the career-related study further supports the programme's academic strength and provides practical, real-world approaches to learning; and the CP core helps them to develop skills and competencies required for lifelong learning.

What is the IBCP?

The IBCP is a framework of international education that incorporates the values of the IB into a unique programme addressing the needs of students engaged in career-related education. The IBCP is a highly regarded and valued qualification with universities, employers both nationally and internationally. Students studying this programme are likely to progress into apprenticeships or university study.

Assessment and Exams

Students take written examinations at the end of their IB Diploma Programme courses which are marked by external IB examiners.

T Levels

Why Choose a Vocational Subject?

BTEC has earned a worldwide reputation as a premier applied learning qualification because it provides learners with a clear route into their career. Today's employers are looking for confident, work ready employees who have practical knowledge and technical skills that are taught when studying a BTEC.

BTECs are coursework focused which means gaining your qualification is usually an equal split of coursework and examinations - this can vary between subjects. Additionally, BTECs can be an excellent way to progress into university, with 95% of universities accepting BTECs, including those in the Russell Group (which includes the likes of Oxford University and Cambridge).

We recommend that all students opt for the IBCP due to its rigour in developing the person into a global citizen developing them in the following learner profile: inquirers, knowledgeable, thinkers, communicators, principled, open-minded, caring, risk-takers, balanced, and reflective.

7-LEVELS

T Levels are an alternative to A Levels, apprenticeships, and other 16-19 courses. They are equivalent to three A-levels, with a focus on vocational skills and can help students into skilled employment, higher studies, or apprenticeships.

T Levels include an in-depth industry placement of at least 45 days, which means students gain valuable experience and employers get to see the talent of the students within that industry.

Strood Football Academy



Students will be able to choose their academic programmes of study from any of our other pathways (IB/A Level/BTEC) and this will be carefully tailored to consider the training requirements of the students.


Enrichment and Extra-Curricular Activities

As a team we acknowledge that Sixth Form life can be both stressful and demanding. It is important we ensure students maintain a balance between learning and wellbeing.

To help with this, we offer our students an enrichment opportunity once a week. Students choose an enrichment option that they must commit to for the entire half term and will get another opportunity to select another option the following half term.

Enrichment options include but are not limited to:

- Mindfulness
- Debate Club
- Exercise and Fitness
- ROAR Female Empowerment Programme
- Coaching Personal Development
- Work Experience



Student Leadership and Student Voice

We expect our learners to be active participants in their own right. We have several opportunities for you to voice your opinions and to make a difference. Sixth Form students are encouraged to apply for positions in the Senior Student Leadership Team; roles that involve engagement with students across the academy. Student leadership at Strood Academy is key to enabling young people to realise their potential whilst building on necessary skills, confidence and motivation to allow students to engage directly in the wider improvement of the school. Appointed members are trained in public speaking and leadership skills to ensure they can articulate their point of view with great competency; enabling them to be effective in what they set out to achieve.

Throughout the academic year we encourage Sixth Form students to lead assemblies both in Sixth Form and the Year 7-11. Sixth Form students are encouraged to take part in the peer mentoring scheme, 1:1 Maths support for Year 11 students and reading support for Year 7 students. A large number of students act as ambassadors at various public events.



Careers and Work Experience

At Strood Academy we prioritise the future of our young people. Students are supported to make successful transitions when they leave the academy whether into apprenticeships, employment or university.

We have a robust Future careers programme that includes support from local Universities, CCCU, Greenwich University. Apprenticeship fair, key speaker assemblies, Career fairs and UniFrog support and guidance and much more.

Students complete a work placement to allow them to gain experience of their chosen career to develop key skills allowing them a better understanding of the work placement and the skills required.

Pastoral Support

Our small school system also provides students with a support network to help them to be successful during their time at Strood Academy Sixth Form. We have three colleges: Hercules, Trafalgar, and Victory. Each college has student support managers, senior student support managers, and a deputy head and head of pastoral. This small school structure means there are staff on hand to support the wellbeing of our students and to provide guidance in their approach to their studies.

Additionally, each student will have a tutor which they will see for 40 minutes each day where important information is relayed and activities in current affairs and careers is provided.

Furthermore, a teaching assistant and a wellbeing manager is based in the sixth form area to ensure there is help and support available at all times.
